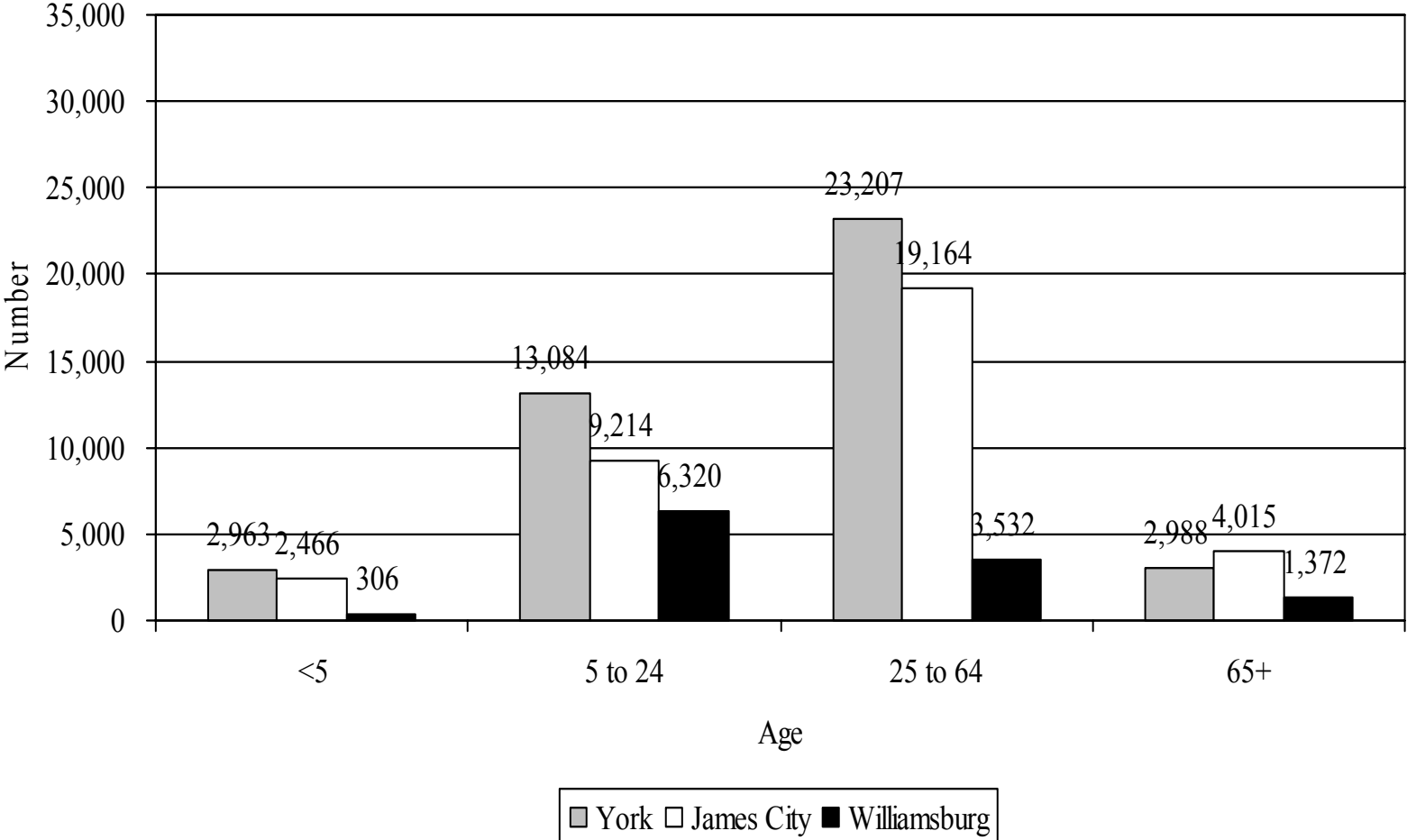

## **The Age Structure:**

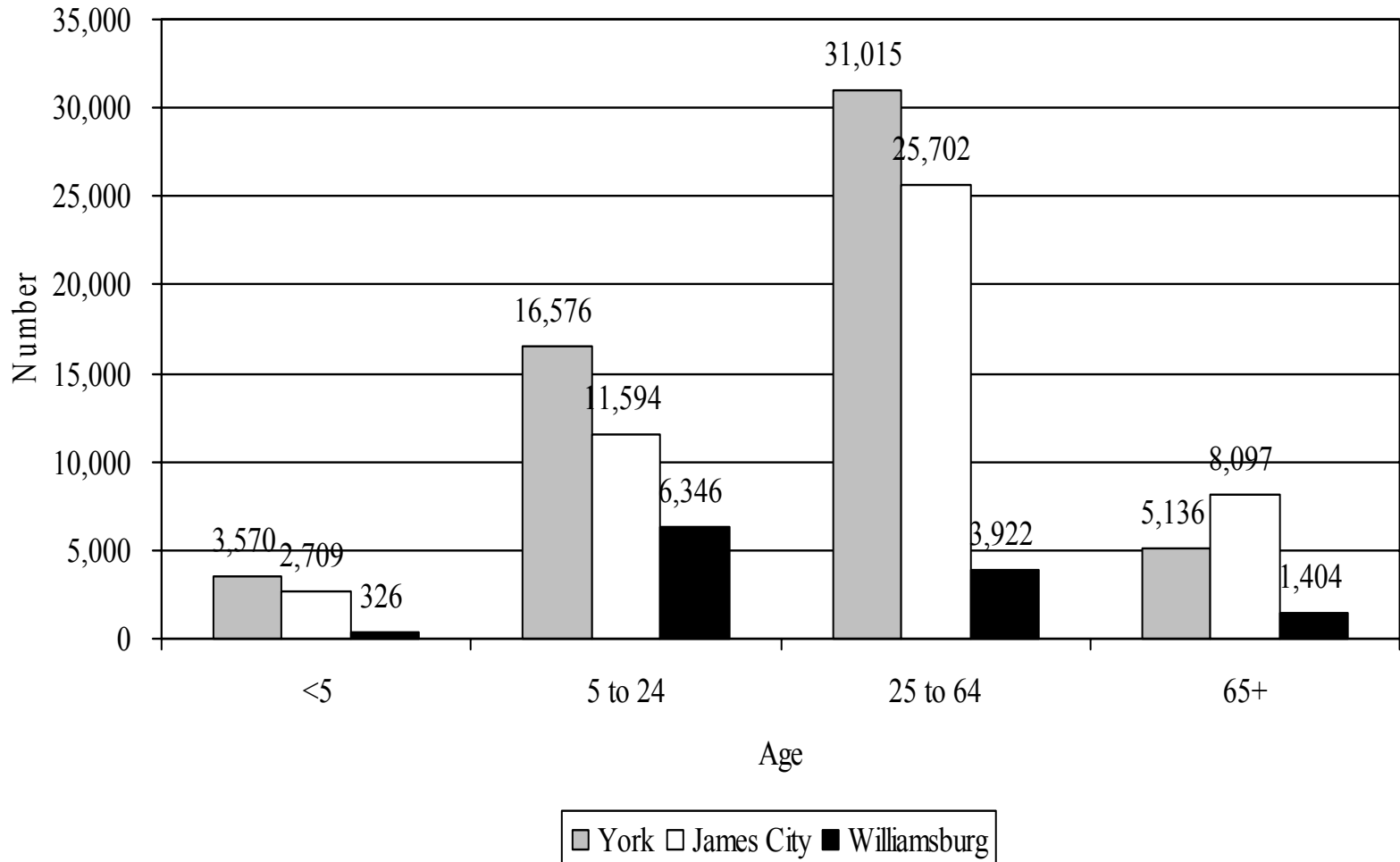
The Williamsburg Area is aging faster than  
the Nation

**In 1990, 12% of Williamsburg and James City’s population was 65 and older, compared to 7% of York’s population.**



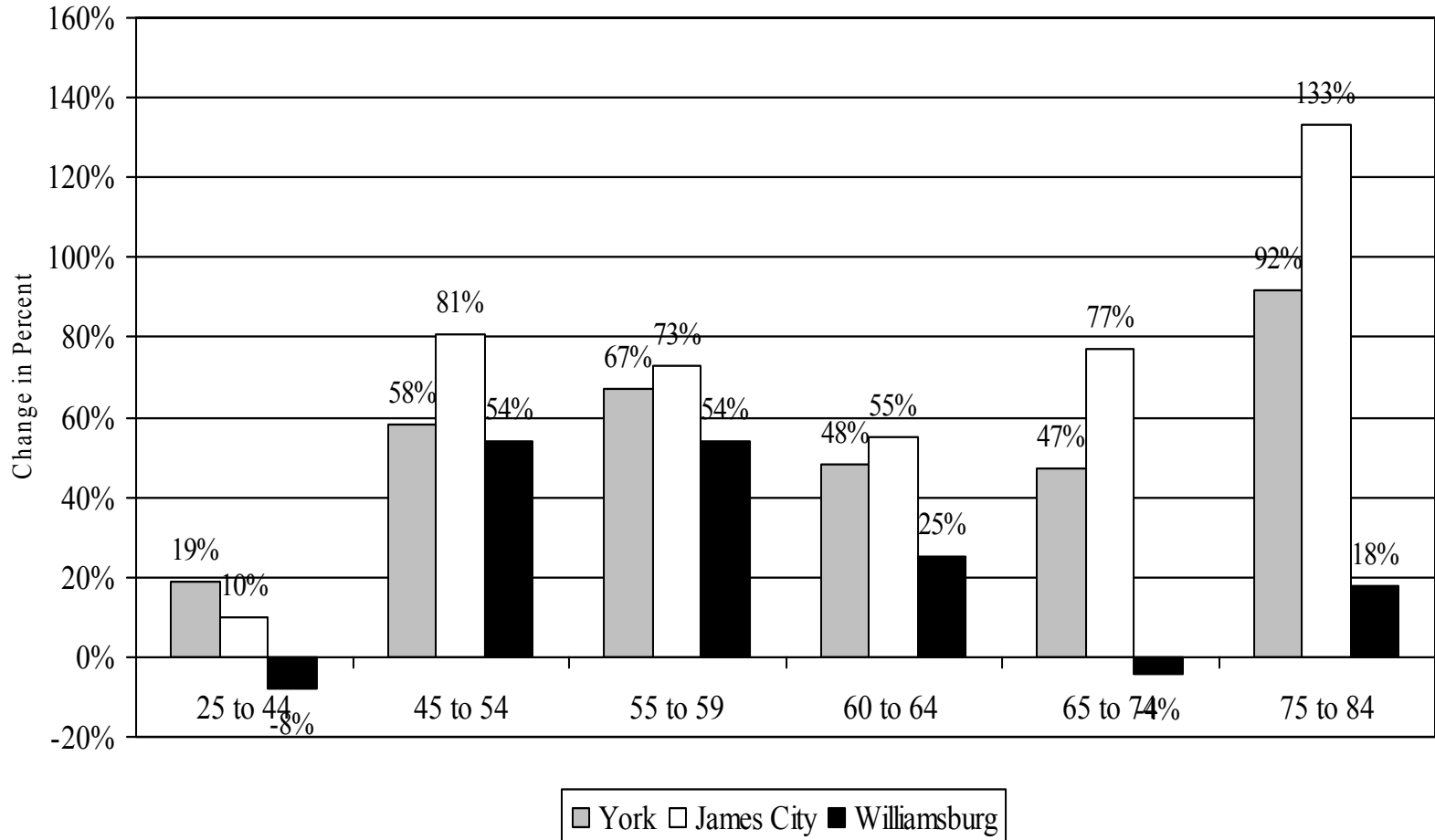

**In 2000, 12% of Williamsburg and 17% of James City’s population was 65 years and older, compared to 9% of York residents.**



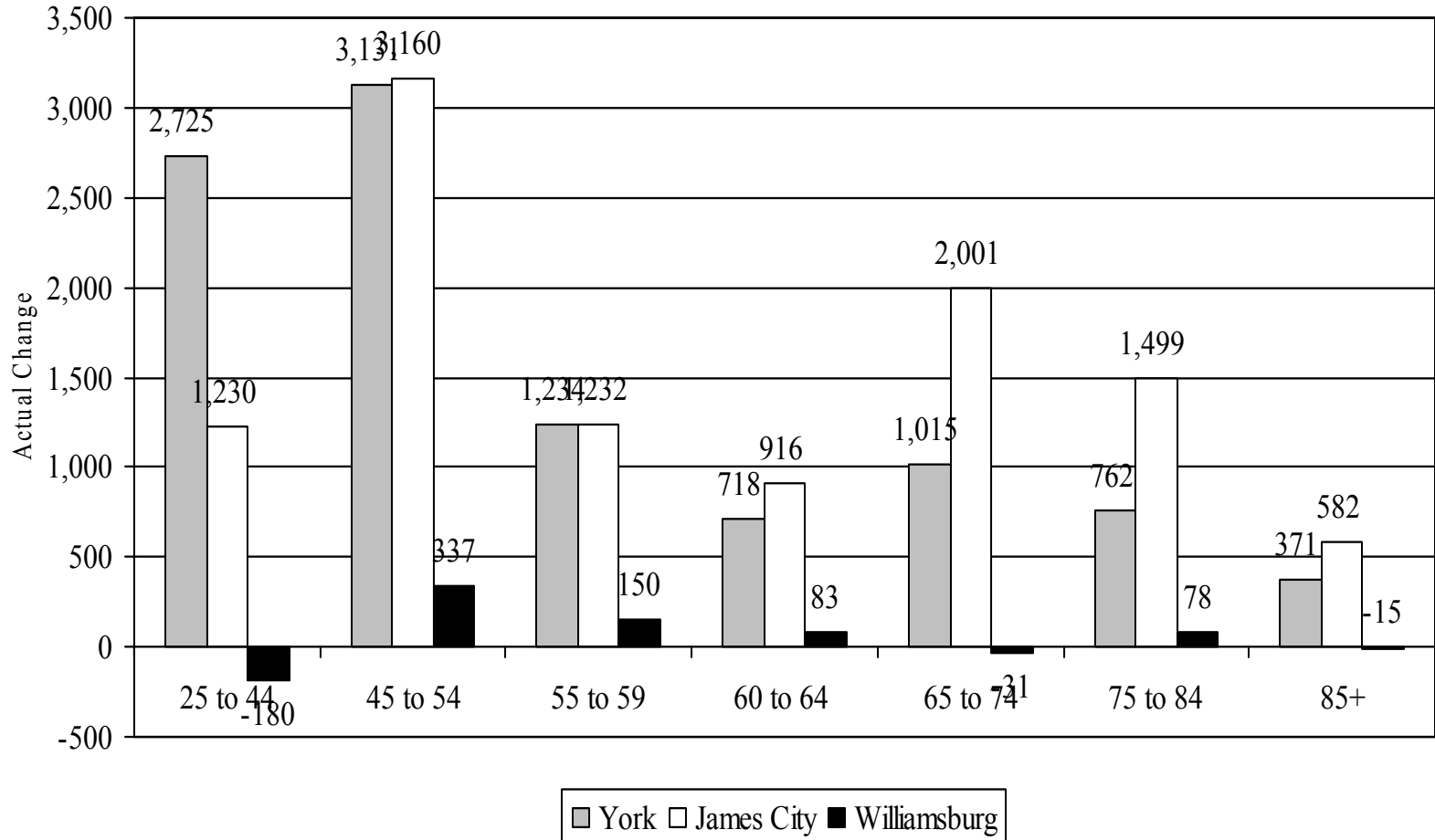

**From 1990 to 2000, the fastest growing segments of James City and York’s population were 75 to 85 years of age. Williamsburg’s fastest growing segment was 45 to 59 years of age.**



Notes: The 85 and over populations in James City, Williamsburg and York changed by 197, -8 and 1,855 percent. The latter figure is why they are not shown in the chart.

**Over the same period, the largest growing segment of James City’s population was 65 and over. The 25 to 54 year old segment was the largest growing in York and the 45 to 54 year old portion was the largest growing in Williamsburg.**



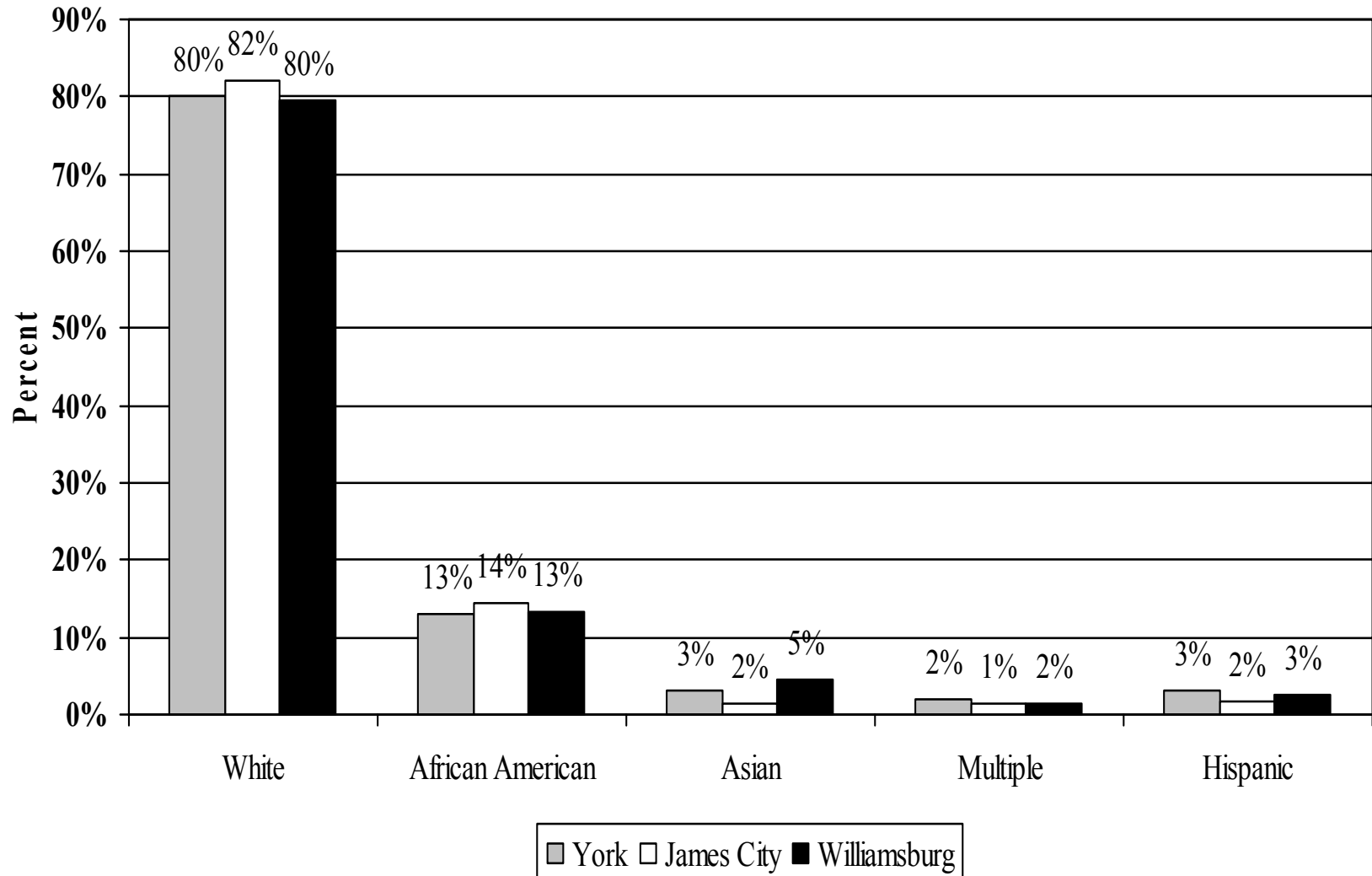

**From 1990 to 2000, the Area's white population experienced the largest growth.**

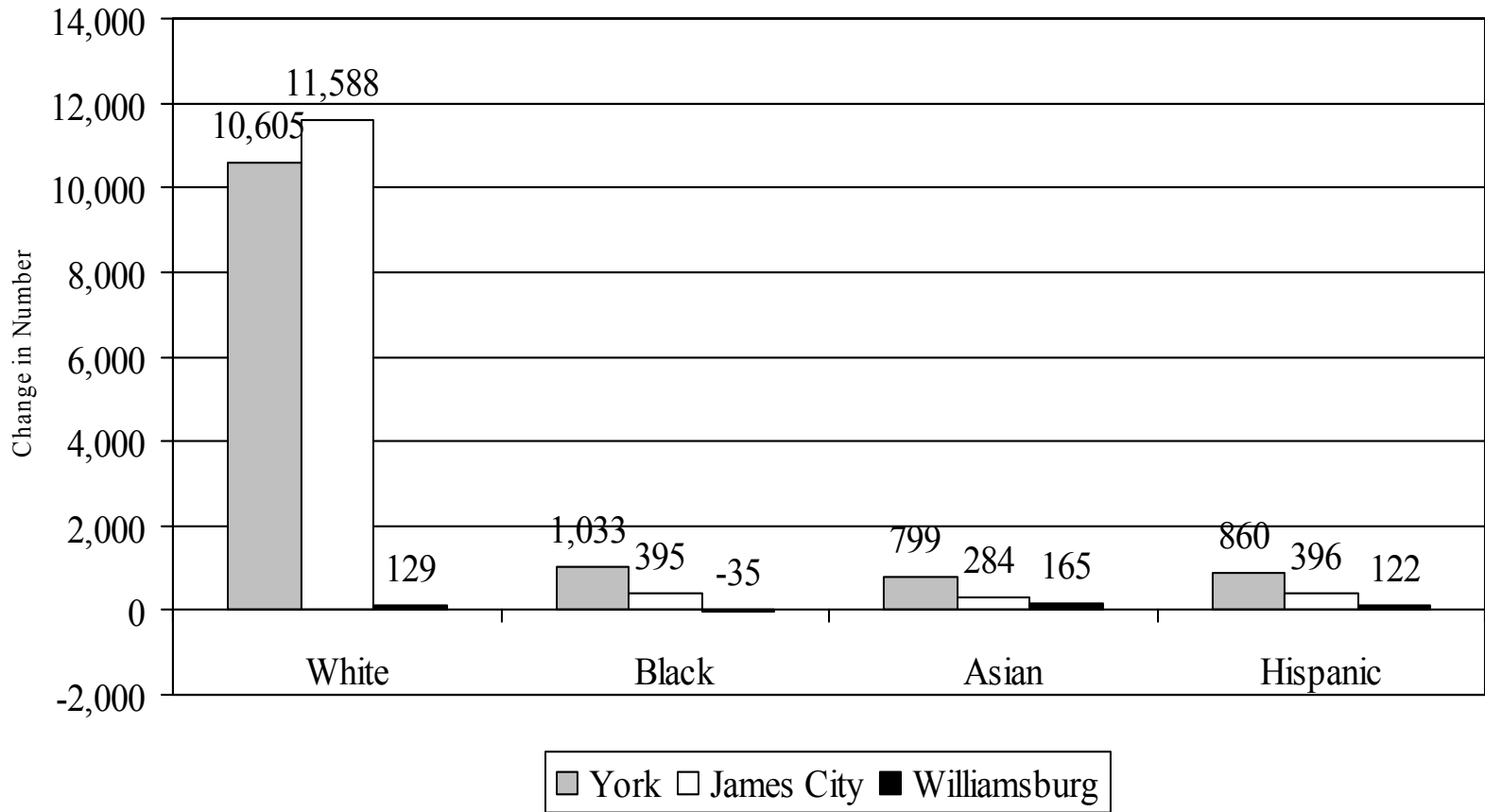
**Over the same period, the Area's Hispanic and Asian population grew the fastest.**

## In 2000, the racial and ethnic compositions of Williamsburg, James City and York are similar.

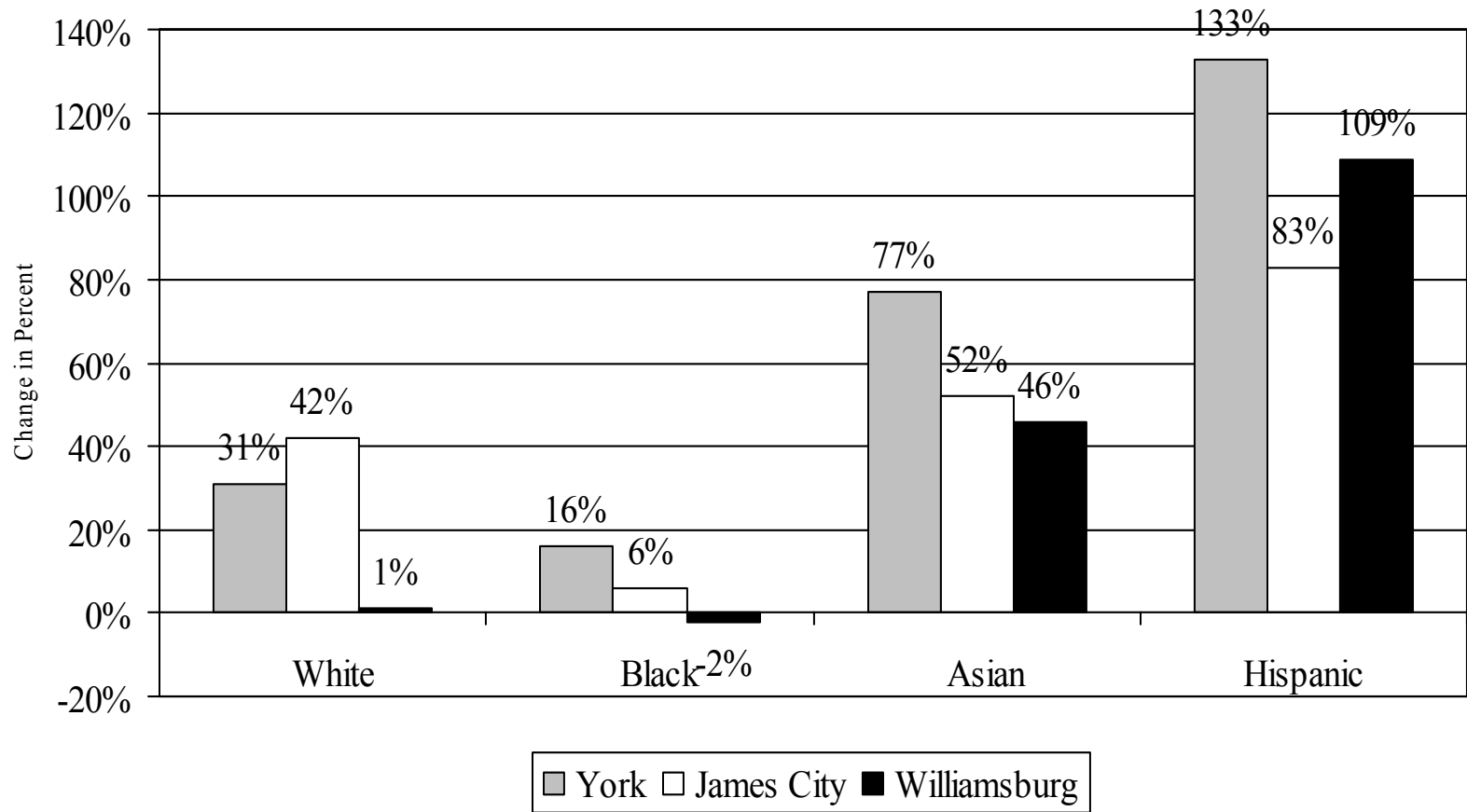

# From 1990 to 2000, the Area's white population experienced the largest growth.



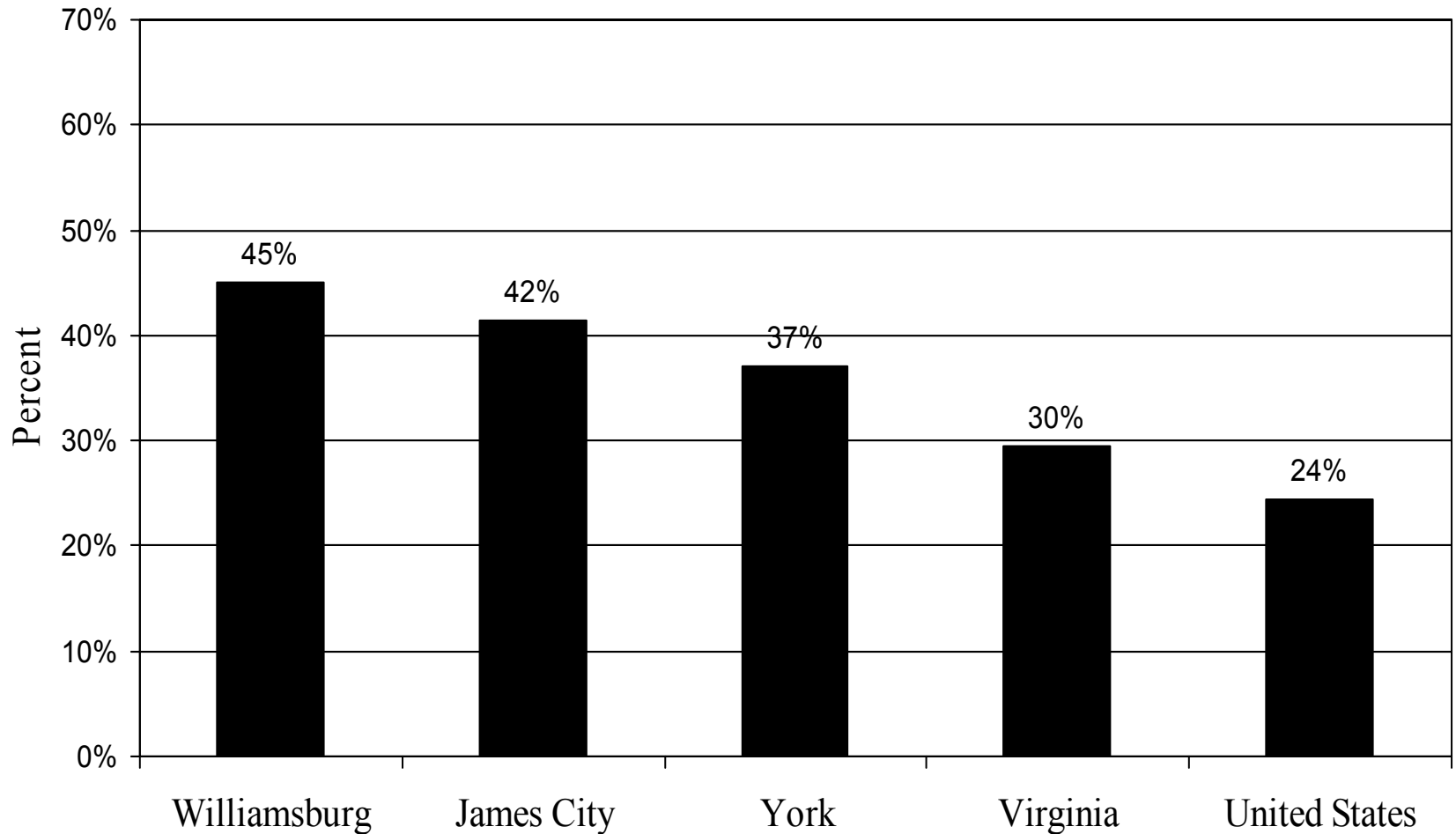

## **Educational Attainment:**

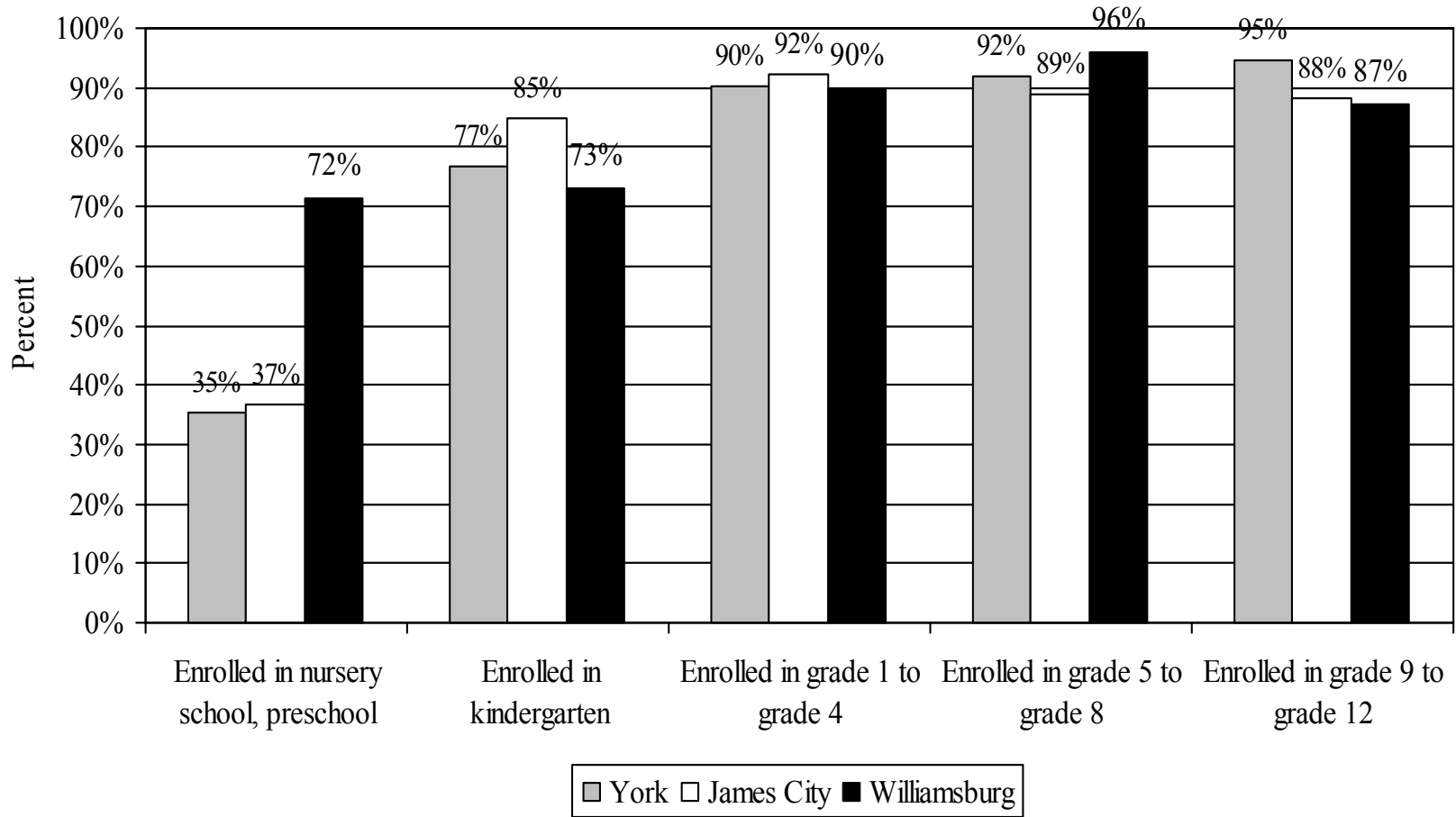
The Portion of Residents in the Williamsburg Area with at least a college degree exceeds the Commonwealth and U.S. averages.

## The Percentage of the Williamsburg Area Adult Population with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher Exceeds the State and National Average

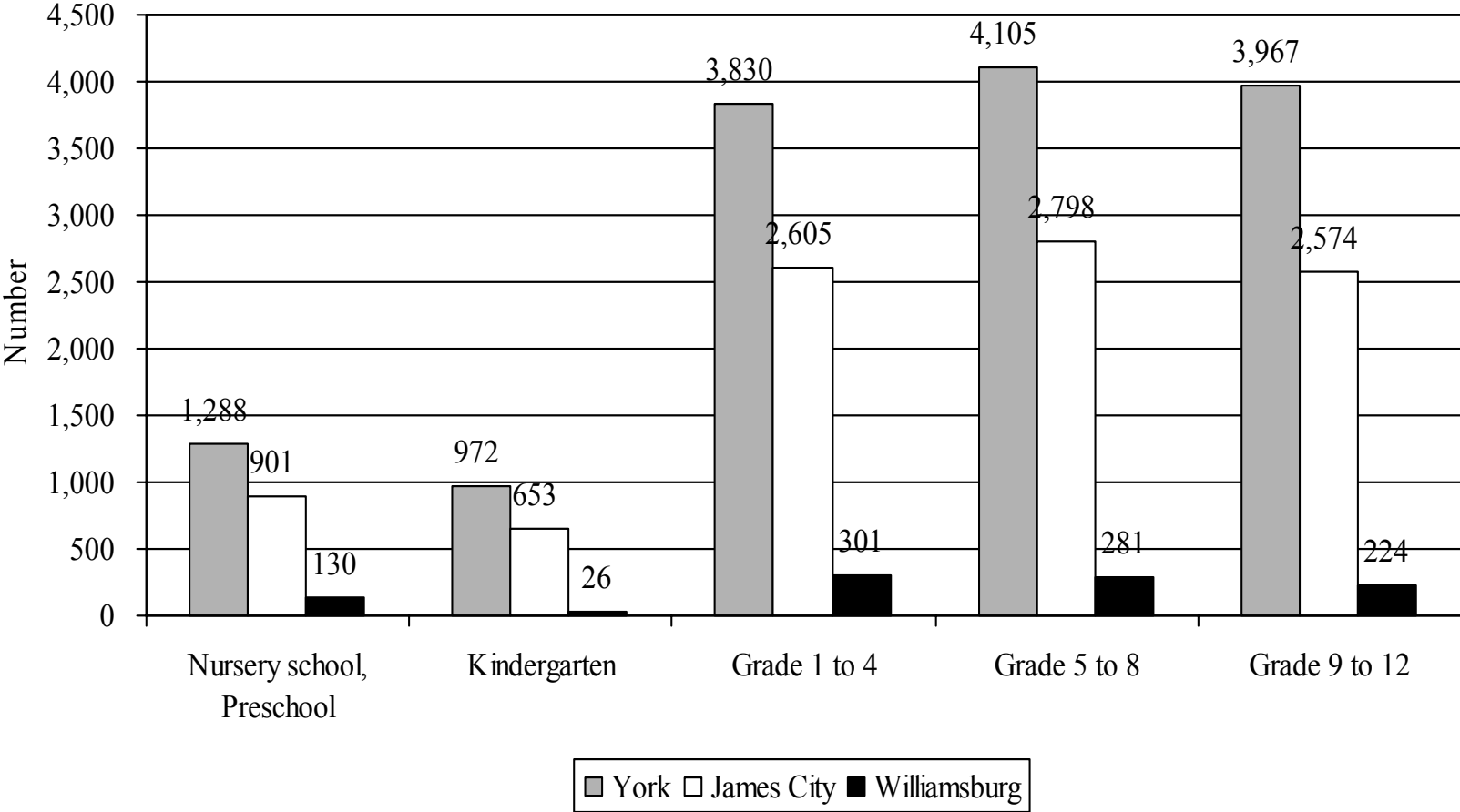


**Public School Enrollment:

# Most School Age Children Attend Public Schools (Percent Enrolled in Public Schools)



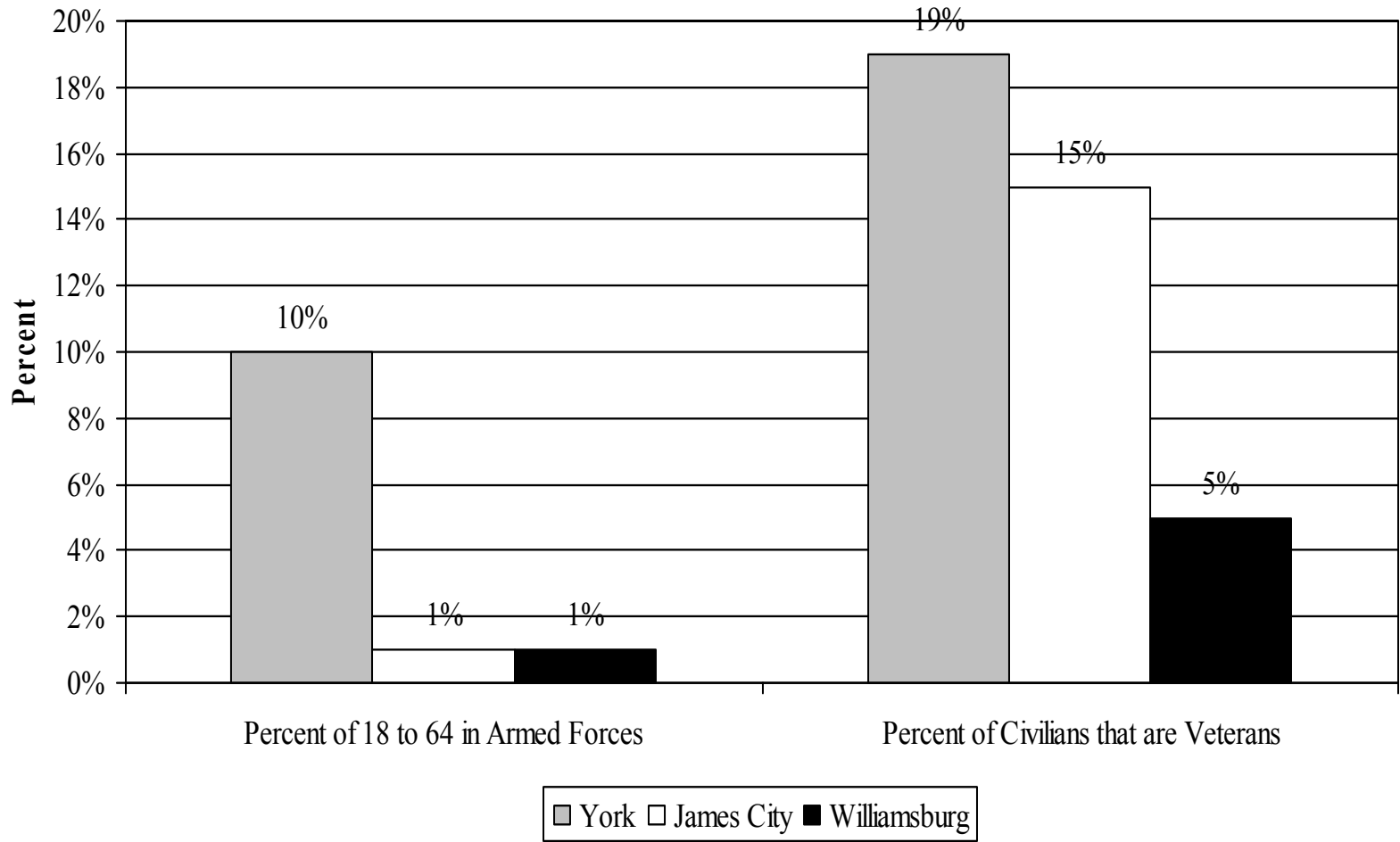
# Williamsburg Contributes a Very Small Number of Children to the Schools



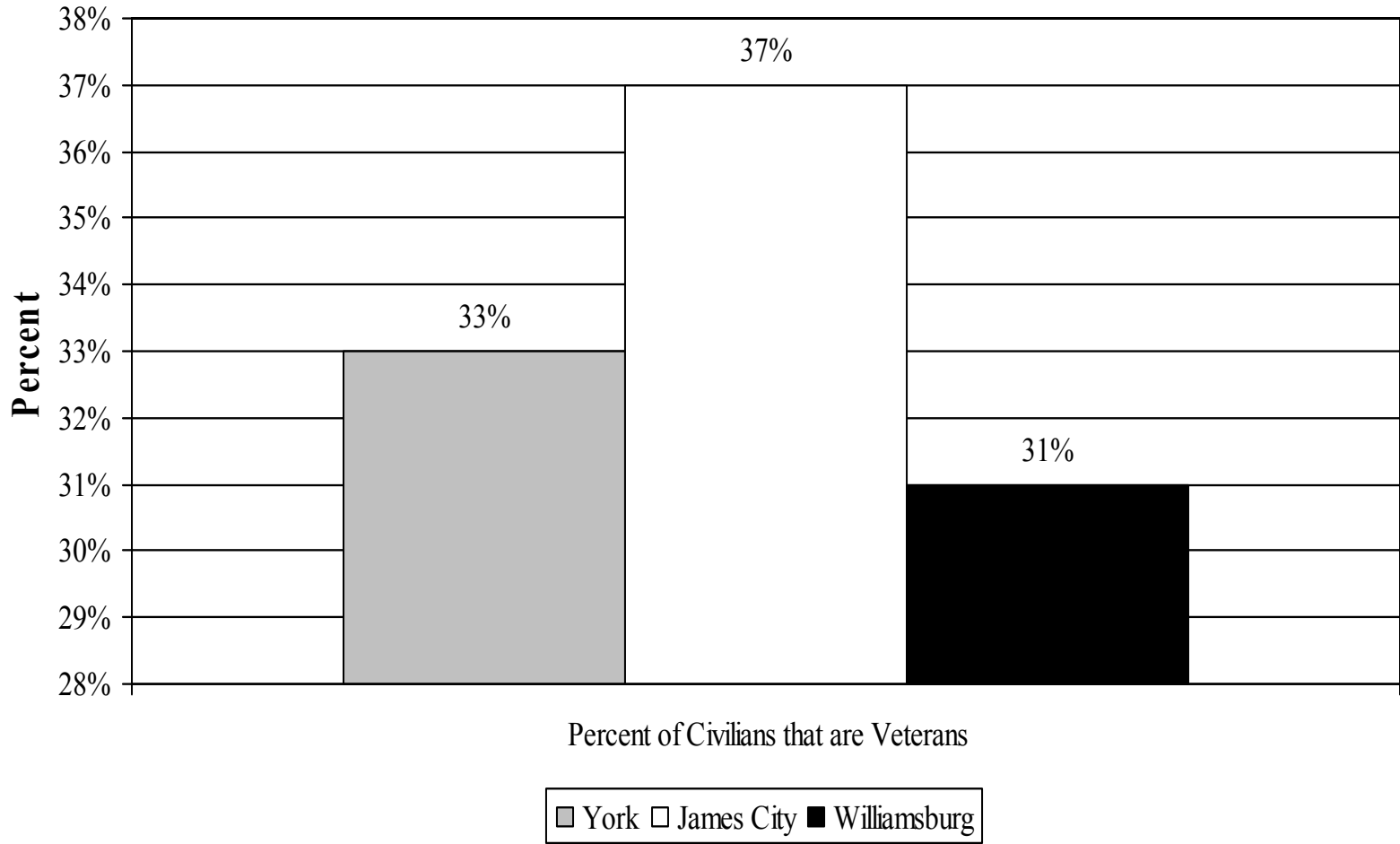

# **Disability Status:**

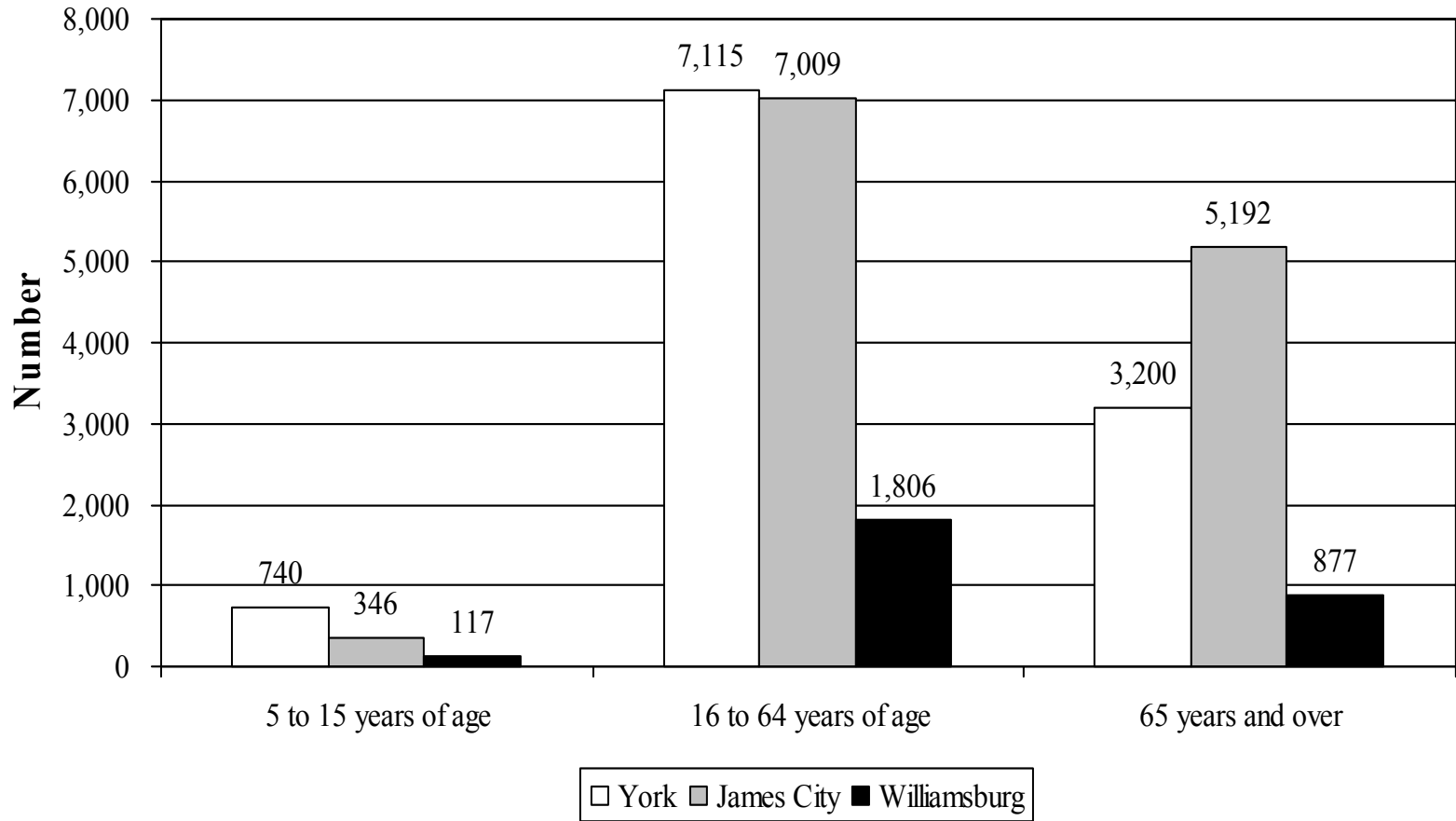
**The Area's Disabled Residents are primarily between 16 to 64 years of age.**

**Mental disabilities are most common for school-age children.**

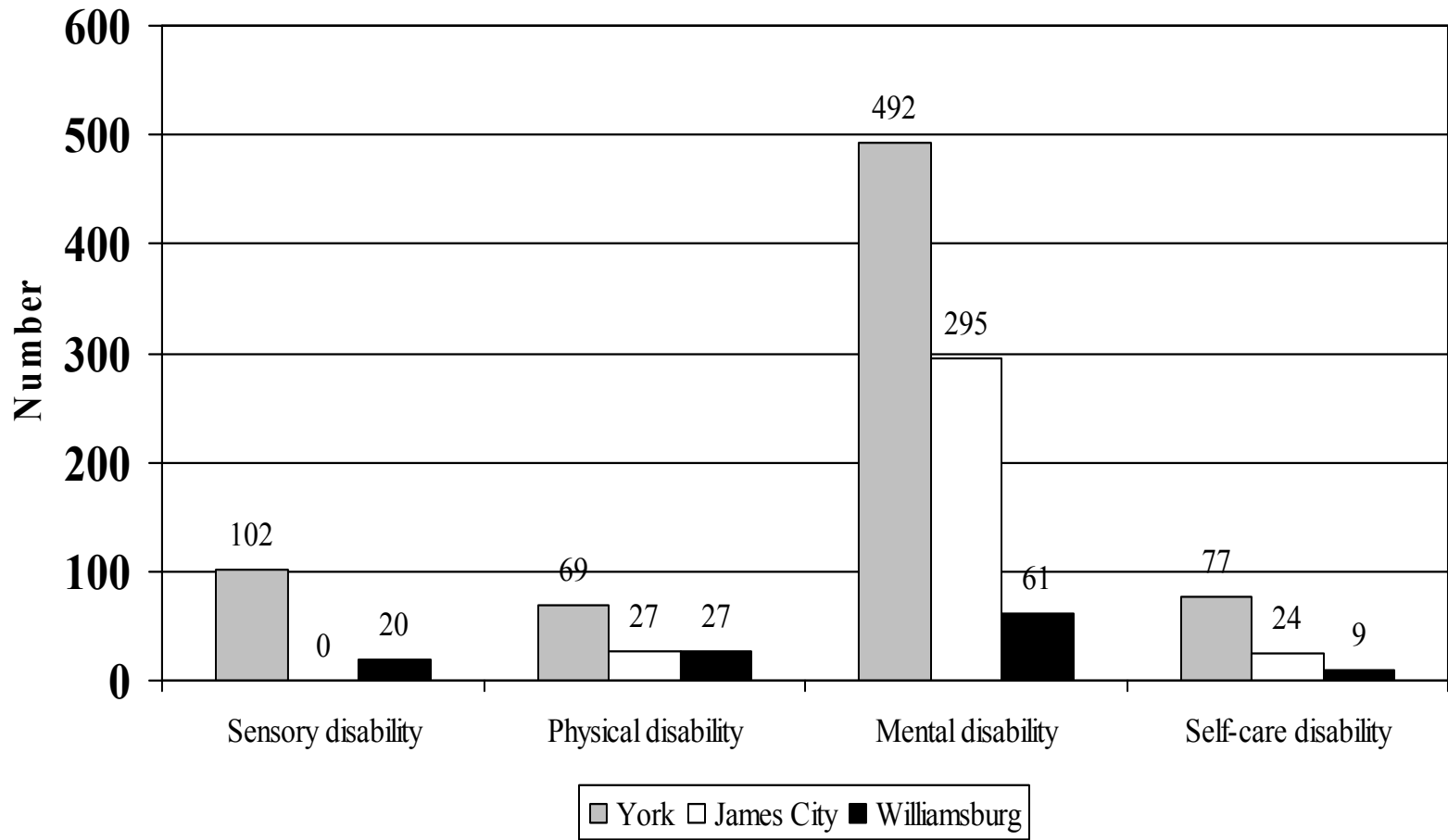
**Employment and physical disabilities are most common working age residents.**

# The Area's Disabled Residents are primarily between 16 to 64 years of age.

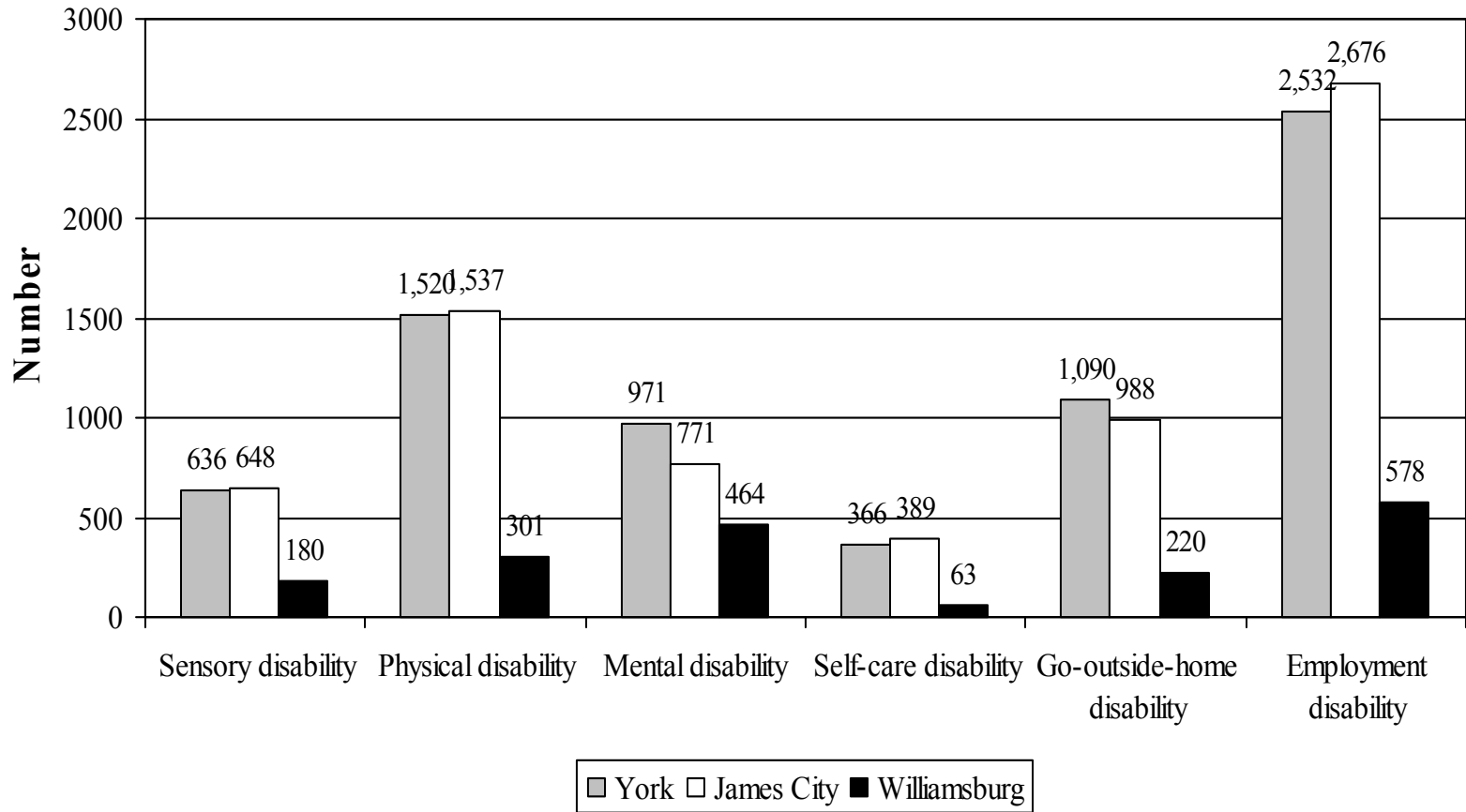


# Mental disabilities are most common for school-age children. (Types of disabilities among 5 to 15 year olds)

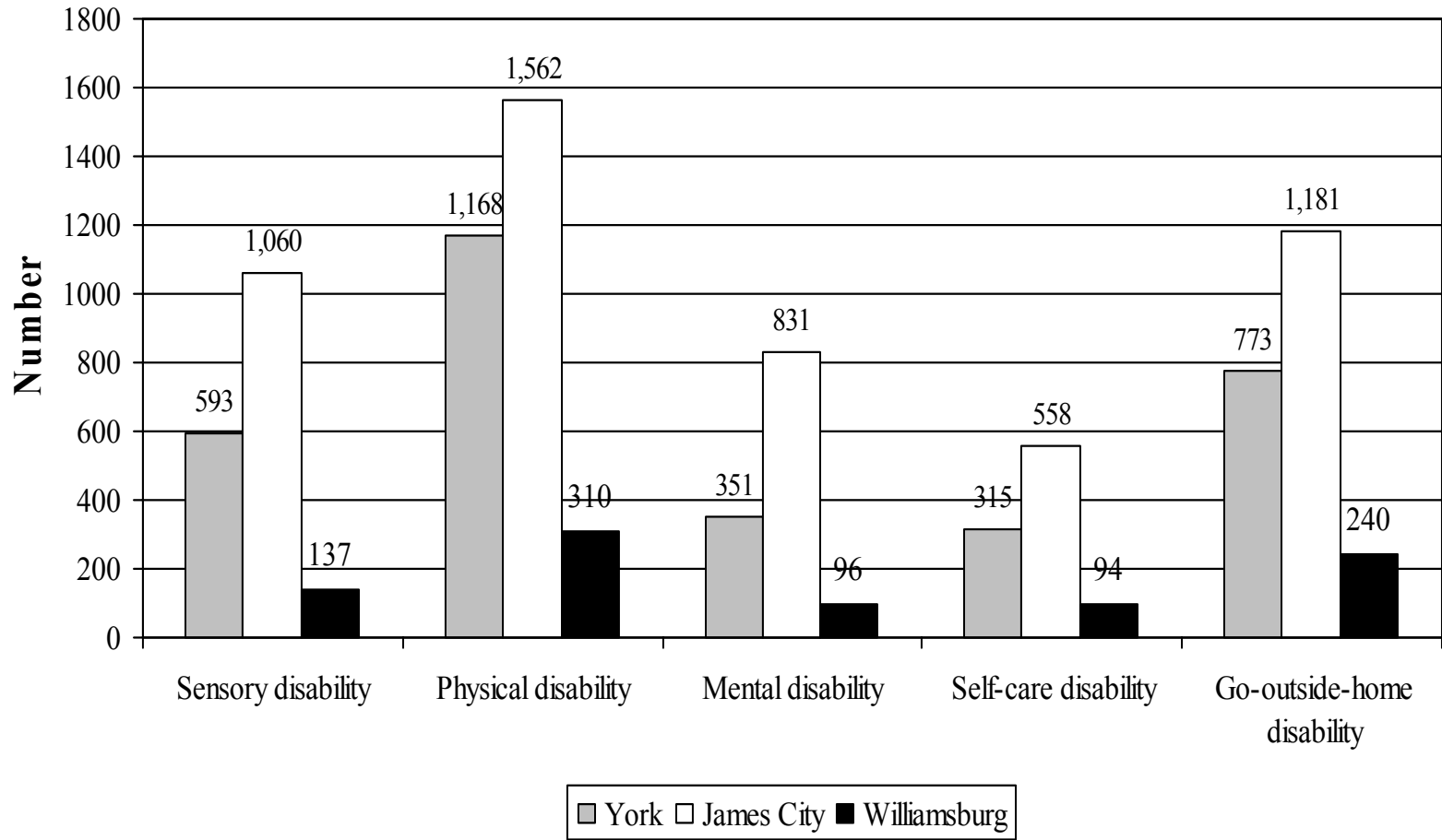


# Employment and physical disabilities are most common working age residents.
