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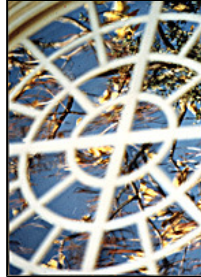
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Founded in 1693, The College of William & Mary is the second oldest college in America.
