

College of William and Mary in Virginia Additional Faculty Credentials Review (Response to Off-Site Review of 3.7.1)

In response to comprehensive standard 3.7.1, the following information is provided to demonstrate the qualification of the College's faculty to teach courses. We present the faculty rosters ordered by faculty members' home departments. Faculty members with appointments in more than one department, they are shown in their primary department appointment. Faculty that teach in more than one instructional (or course) department have all their courses presented together. Courses for the 2004-2005 academic year, terms fall 2004 and spring 2005, are included.

The data are provided in four major groups as prescribed by SACS instruction. These data categories and specific data elements are as follows.

Category 1:

Department - Home department of faculty member

Name - The faculty member's name

Full-Time or Part-Time - 'F' for full-time faculty appointment
'P' for part-time faculty appointment

Tenure Status - 'T' Tenured faculty
'ONT' On tenure-track faculty
'NON' Non tenure-track faculty
'GTA' Graduate teaching assistant (or teaching fellow)

Category 2:

Course - The course identifier: the abbreviation for the course department, course number, and section number.

Course Title - The course title from the catalog

Term - Term the course was taught (Fall 2004 or Spring 2005).

Course Level - Instructional level of the course:

'U' = undergraduate

'L' = law

'G' = graduate

Course Discipline - The best discipline match to describe the course content using the 1990 CIP codes.

Credits - The number of credits awarded for the course.

Enrollment - The number of students enrolled for the course.

Category 3:

Degree Type - The faculty member's higher degree earned.

Terminal - Terminal degree indicator (Yes or No)

Degree Discipline - The best discipline match to describe the field of study associated with a faculty member's degree field using the 1990 CIP codes.

Category 4:

Credential Guideline - The corresponding 3.7.1 *Credential Guideline* that applies to the matching of course level and discipline to the faculty member's degree level and discipline. Guidelines d, e, and f apply to the College's instructional program.

3.7.1d - *"Faculty teaching baccalaureate courses: doctor's or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline)."*

3.7.1e - *"Faculty teaching graduate and post-baccalaureate course work: earned doctorate/ terminal degree in the teaching discipline or a related discipline."*

3.7.1f - *"Graduate teaching assistants: master's in the teaching discipline or 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline, direct supervision by a faculty member experienced in the teaching discipline, regular in-service training, and planned and periodic evaluations."*
