## Tribe Athletics in the Fall

This was a fall of ups and downs for the Tribe on the field. Our football team spanked #1 ranked New Hampshire early in the season but finished with some tough losses to end up 5-6. Volleyball had one of its strongest seasons this fall finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the CAA with a 22-8 record, but stumbled in the opening round of the conference tournament. Field Hockey finished around .500 but managed to make it to the semi-finals of the CAA tournament. Men's and Women's Soccer were rarely up or down in that they combined for 13 ties, with the women setting the NCAA record for ties in a season. The Cross-Country squads excelled as usual with the Men and Women finishing 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>, respectively, in the NCAA championships.

## Alumni Update—Where are they now???

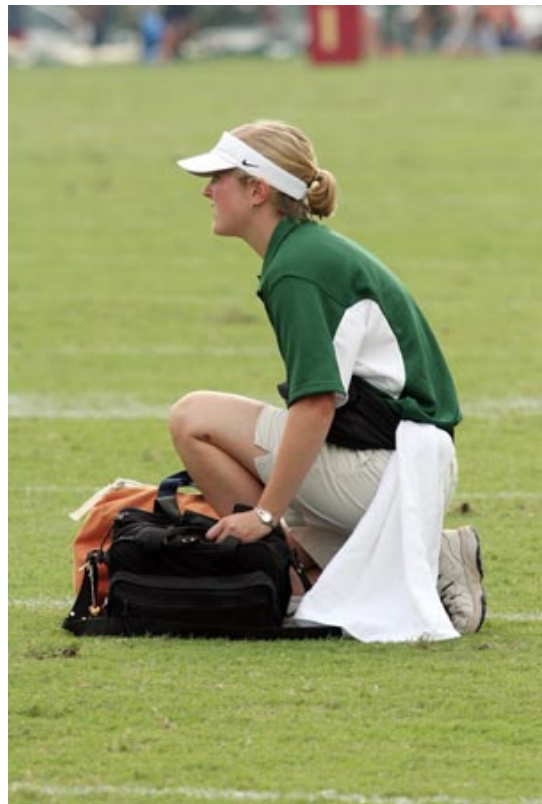

## Athletic Training Aide Program Continues to Grow

A couple of years ago, we developed the Athletic Training Aide program to give students with an interest in medicine to volunteer to work with different aspects of our program, depending on their individual career goals. For example, students who plan to pursue careers in physical therapy may choose to volunteer during our morning clinical hours. They work side-by-side with the staff athletic trainers, observing patient evaluations, learning rehabilitation techniques, and practicing hands-on patient care under our supervision. On the other hand, students who seek to enter medical school or a graduate athletic training curriculum may choose to work at football in a paid position.

This year, we continued to offer both the volunteer program as well as the paid football positions for students to work on the football staff as athletic training aides. Our volunteers in the morning were very eager to learn and to get involved in patient care. They very quickly became an important component of our morning staff as they became more and more proficient in their role. Likewise, the football group was invaluable to the daily operation at the stadium. They began during preseason and continued to work practices and games throughout the year. These students—veterans **Jessica Bain, Chris Frantz,**

**Christine Orlowicz, Chris Racine,** and rookie **Leslie Short** (pictured on the right)—earned the respect of the players, coaches, and physicians, and staff with their dedication and skill.
